ICAA Influencers: *Patrick Ahearn*




In this episode of *ICAA Influencers*, architect <u>Patrick Ahearn, FAIA</u> discusses the historical influences that guided and shaped his career. After training as a modernist, he found himself inspired by the traditional architecture of New England, and as he describes it, "I really started to get a sense of how classical architecture could influence people, and how classical architecture really embraces the human spirit and scale in a wonderful way." Royal Barry Wills, Greene and Greene, and of course the legendary McKim, Mead and White inspired Patrick's designs as he reshaped entire city blocks in Back Bay and Edgartown, and established himself as one of the premier architects in New England.

The Elements of Classical Architecture: The Tuscan Order in Design, Parts I & II with Mark Jackson



Part I: Saturday, September 11, 2021 Part II: Saturday, September 25, 2021 10:00 AM - 3:30 PM EDT

This hands-on drawing course in The Elements of Classical Architecture sequence picks up where the Introduction to the Tuscan Order course leaves off.

Tuscan Order in Design - Part I introduces the extended apparatus of classical forms, syntax, and principles of composition related to the Tuscan Order. The course provides an orientation to the manner in which the Tuscan Order and related classical elements are combined to ensure each part is related to a larger whole and is tectonically sound.

The Tuscan Order in Design – Part II explores the use of the Tuscan order within an interior and exterior architectural composition in a manner that ensures that the individual components of the design are integrated into a coherent and unified whole. The course introduces classical design principles, 'rules of thumb,' and compositional devices and strategies that are deployed to achieve a design that exhibits the attributes of stability, legibility, and harmony.

This program will be held virtually via Zoom. Participants will receive a link to the program the week prior to the event. Due to the hands-on nature of the course, registration is limited.
