Andrea Palladio's *The Four Books on Architecture* is unquestionably the most influential architectural treatise ever written. The treatise's Book IV consists of Palladio's illustrations and descriptions of twenty-five Roman temples. From his study of their ruins Palladio produced ninety-seven pages of elevations, sections, plans, and

details depicting his concepts of the temples' original appearance.

Join architectural historian Calder Loth for an AIA-credited online lecture that offers a glimpse of the riches of Book IV and presents numerous examples of structures that drew inspiration from Palladio's plates.
