

Stephen Byrns, who founded the Untermyer Gardens Conservancy in 2011 to restore what was called "America's Most Spectacular Garden," offers a peek at both restored features like the Walled Garden, the Visa, and the Outlook, as well as ongoing projects, including new garden plantings and the repair of the picturesque ruined gatehouse.

For his work in founding the Conservancy and leading the restoration of these gardens, Stephen Byrns received the 2017 Stanford White Award for Stewardship.

Gilly & Schinckel and Athens on the Spree: Berlin Architecture 1790-1840 with Barry Bergdoll



In 1789, as French *citoyens* attacked the medieval fortified castle-turned-prison at the edge of the French capital, the Hohenzollern monarchy in Prussia responded by breaching the city wall of its capital, to create an image of the ancient propylaeum

entrance to Berlin, the Brandenburg Gate. For the next half century, until the death of Karl Friedrich Schinkel in 1841, a modest courtly city was to be changed into a stage for a new negotiation between public and power, as Berlin fashioned itself as the "Spreeathen", or Athens on the Spree River.

Berlin neo-classicism quickly emerged not only as a national project but as rethinking of the very training of a new architectural profession, one whose role would extend not only to the expansion of the Prussian state after the final defeat of Napoleon, but to an expanding market for architecture among a growing class of merchants and industrialists. This lecture focuses on the Berlin School from Carl Gotthard Langhans and the Gillys, father and son, to Schinkel.

On Wednesday, July 15th the ICAA hosted Barry Bergdoll, Professor of Art History at Columbia University and former Chief Curator of Architecture and Design at the Museum of Modern Art, for an online lecture on the legacy of two German architects who were instrumental to the development of Berlin during a crucial period from the late 18th century to the mid 19th century.

Lani Summerville is owner and director of <u>Classical Excursions</u>, which specializes in architectural tours that celebrate traditional design. Ms. Summerville has organized, escorted and guided specialty architectural tours for 20 years, working with Sir John Soane's Museum Foundation, The National Trust for Scotland, Olana Foundation and The Institute of Classical Architecture & Art. She has also worked within the preservation field as both a museum educator, and an archaeologist for such organizations as the National Trust for Historic Preservation, The Berkshire County Historical Society, and various other historic house museums.

Textile guru **Lisa Fine** is the founder of <u>Lisa Fine Textiles</u>, which specializes in hand printed linens originally inspired by India's colors, patterns, Mughal palaces, and gardens. Since then Fine's far reaching travels have continued to influence her collection, where exotic and traditional prints in vibrant and romantic colors feel both worldly and timeless. Her work has appeared in countless publications, and prior to designing textiles, she worked as a contributing editor for *Elle Decor* and *House Beautiful*. She is currently a contributing editor for *Town & Country*. Her book, *Near & Far: Interiors I Love*, was published in October 2019 by Vendome.

Kathryn Herman is an ICAA Board Member and the founding principal of her landscape design firm, <u>Kathryn Herman Design</u>. The firm's work in landscape architecture and residential design has received multiple Arthur Ross Awards, Stanford White Awards, and Palladio Awards, and has been featured in *Architectural Digest*, Veranda, and *Gardens Illustrated*.

Thursday, October 15 12:00 PM EDT / 9:00 AM PDT


Please join the Institute of Classical Architecture & Art (ICAA) for a virtual lecture on Wednesday, October 15th with Arne Maynard.

In this online lecture, delivered live by Arne from Allt y bela, his home in Wales, UK, he will explain how he creates planted structure, talking us through some of his signature plants and explaining how he uses them in his designs. Using photographs and short films from his own garden and some private gardens he has designed that are rarely seen by the public, this lecture will give viewers a personal insight into Arne's love of plants.




