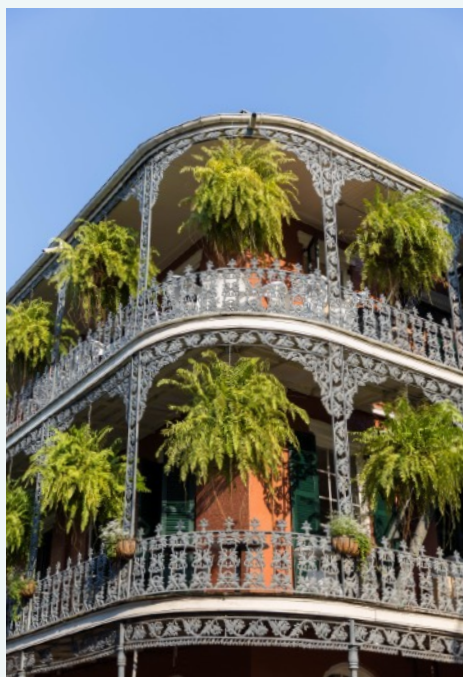
THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 5 – SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 8, 2026 (3 NIGHTS)

THE WINDSOR COURT

Located just outside of the French Quarter in the Central Business District, the Windsor Court Hotel is a classic, large New Orleans property. The décor of the 316 guest rooms and suites reflects the hotel's traditionally English and French style with heavy drapes, traditional furnishings and antique photographs of the Mississippi River. The large common areas, including the grand hotel lobby where English tea is served daily, and the Polo Club Lounge that features jazz bands many nights, create a buzzing atmosphere. Club level rooms on the top four floors offer panoramic views of the city and the Mississippi River along with extra amenities and a lounge.

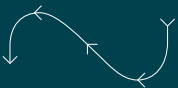

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Itinerary



DAY 1, NOV. 5: WELCOME TO NEW ORLEANS

- Upon arrival in New Orleans, meet your private driver and transfer to the hotel for check-in and time to refresh. *Check-in begins at 3:00 p.m.*
- In the early evening, head to the Garden District for drinks at the private residence of a New Orleans local.
- Following drinks, continue to the Irish Channel for a festive welcome dinner at Mallalieu Harmony Church, a former church restored by the Castello family.

OVERNIGHT: THE WINDSOR COURT | MEALS: D

DAY 2, NOV. 6: FRENCH QUARTER

- Start the morning with a light breakfast at the private home of architects Bill Brockschmidt and Richard Dragisic.
- Embark on a guided walking tour of the French Quarter with architectural historian John Stubbs, who will take you through Jackson Square, the Pontalba Buildings and Royal Street, with private access to select residences and landmarks.
- Lunch at one of Indagare's favorite restaurants, followed by an afternoon exploring New Orleans' historic houses and museums, including the Hermann-Grima House, Gallier House, Madame John's Legacy and the Beauregard-Keyes House, as well as select private homes.
- Cocktails hosted at the home of a local member of the preservation community.
- Dinner is at leisure this evening.

DAY 3, NOV. 7: CENTRAL BUSINESS & GARDEN DISTRICTS

- Guided driving tour of the Faubourg Marigny and Bywater neighborhoods, including a stop at Lombard Plantation—one of the city's last remaining West Indian-style Creole manor houses—before continuing to the Holy Cross District.
- Enjoy lunch at a local spot in the Central Business District.
- Explore the Garden District and Uptown, with exclusive access to the exquisite homes of content producer and entrepreneur Permele Robinson, designer and writer Sara Ruffin Costello, entrepreneur Jane Scott Hodges and interior designer Nina Farmer.
- End the day with a festive cocktail reception at the home of a local architect, who will offer a unique perspective on New Orleans design.
