PRACTICALITIES:

Included: All admissions to sites on final itinerary; any pre-arranged meals; private bus transportation to/from Teotihuacán.

Not included: Travel to/from and accommodation in Mexico City; all meals apart from pre-arranged group meals; all materials and supplies.

Important note on physical requirements: This program involves a significant amount of walking each day. Participants should be comfortable walking for extended periods and standing for prolonged site visits. Prepare for warm weather, sun and rainstorms.

Group size: Up to 18 students total.
